

## Advancing Trauma-Informed Care Pilot Sites

*Advancing Trauma-Informed Care*, led by the Center for Health Care Strategies (CHCS) through support from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, is a national initiative aimed at understanding how trauma-informed approaches can be practically implemented across the health care sector. The multi-site demonstration is supporting six health care organizations in expanding and enhancing trauma-informed approaches with the goal of improving patient outcomes, maintaining a healthy workforce, and decreasing costs. Following is a description of the pilot sites:

Pilot Site	Care Setting/Population Served	Pilot Effort
<b>Center for Youth Wellness</b> San Francisco, CA	Children's health organization within a primary care pediatric home serving children and families in District 10 of San Francisco	Implement adverse childhood experiences (ACE) screening, care coordination, and data management strategies to further its integrated care approach to address the physical and behavioral health needs of families with ACEs exposure.
<b>Greater Newark Healthcare Coalition</b> Newark, NJ	Partnership between a hospital-based primary care pediatric home and designated elementary schools serving children and families in the South Ward neighborhood of Newark	Establish care coordination, trauma screening and treatment, professional development for health and education partners, and data integration practices.
<b>Montefiore Medical Group</b> Bronx, NY	Integrated care system providing primary, behavioral health, and specialty care to adults and children from low-income and diverse communities in the Bronx and lower Westchester County	Train all staff within its 22 practice outpatient ambulatory care network in trauma-informed approaches to care using a multi-disciplinary train-the-trainer model.
<b>San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFPDH)</b> San Francisco, CA	Public clinics serving the residents of the city of San Francisco	Infuse trauma-informed principles into SFPDH by developing a trauma-informed leadership model, learning community, and collaborative workgroup.
<b>Stephen and Sandra Sheller 11th Street Family Health Services</b> Philadelphia, PA	Nurse-led community health center serving low-income, medically underserved residents in North Philadelphia	Train all staff to adopt a standard approach to collective mindfulness practice and use an integrated mind-body treatment model in working with patients who have experienced trauma.
<b>Women's HIV Program at the University of California, San Francisco</b> San Francisco, CA	Ryan White HIV/AIDS clinic providing primary care to women and girls living with HIV	Develop a formal service integration partnership with the Trauma Recovery Center at San Francisco General Hospital to address the effects of lifetime trauma on adults.
