Medicaid is the nation's largest health insurance program, covering more than 90 million people and spending nearly \$750 billion annually.* Yet, Medicaid directors and their senior teams have limited resources and opportunities to cultivate their leadership skills to maximize Medicaid's positive impact on the health of state and territory residents.

Since 2009, the **Medicaid Leadership Institute** (MLI) has supported 77 Medicaid directors and their senior teams from 45 Medicaid agencies in cultivating leadership skills.
