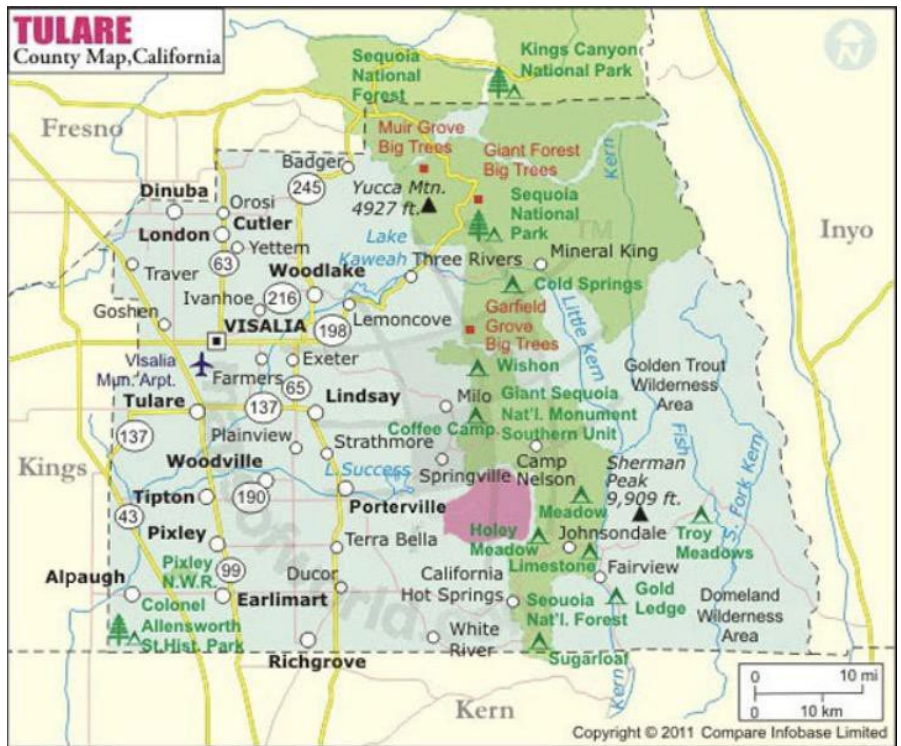




# System of Care Snapshot: Kings and Tulare Counties, California

May 10, 2024





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# Executive Summary

Kings County is a rich agricultural region spanning a land area of 1,391 square miles located in the San Joaquin Valley. According to the [2023 U.S. Census report](#), Kings County is home to a population of 152,682 individuals. Tulare County has a growing population of 476,468 ([2023 Census report](#)) and includes an area of 4,863 square miles, spanning the San Joaquin Valley to the Sierra Nevada.

The [Kings and Tulare Counties 2023 Point in Time \(PIT\) Report](#) shows that in Kings County there were 417 homeless individuals with 310 people unsheltered compared to 117 sheltered individuals. This is a 171% increase in homelessness since 2013 and a 138% increase since 2018. In 2023, 159 individuals were those living with a disability, and 27 veterans were counted. In Tulare County in 2023, there were 1,053 homeless individuals, of which 779 individuals were unsheltered and 274 sheltered. This is a 91% increase in the homeless population since 2013 and 33% increase since 2018. In 2023, 430 people were reported to have a disability and 65 veterans were counted.

In both counties on a single night in 2023, 1,470 individuals were counted as homeless. Over 74% of the population was unsheltered and 9.9% of the population was Black/African American compared to 2.7% in the general population and 7.7% of the population was Native American compared to 1.8% in the general population. In both counties, the majority of the homeless population were males (805/62%) while females (555) comprised 38% of the homeless population. In 2021, 3,940 people accessed homeless services including 1,956 individuals, 2,048 families and 458 unaccompanied youth.

Anthem Blue Cross identified 3,593 homeless members in Tulare County and 387 homeless members in Kings County for the period of January 2022 through April 2022. CalViva identified 222 homeless members in Kings County during the same period.

The purpose of this report is to describe the system of care for serving unhoused populations and the assets in the community to meet their needs. The report was compiled from internet research and individual interviews with key community members.

The [Kings/Tulare Homeless Alliance \(KTHA\)](#) is the designated Continuum of Care (CoC) shared jointly between both counties. The community follows a strategic plan and approach called Every Door Open for Coordinated Entry System (CES) access and collaborative funding for both Kings and Tulare Counties. Providers across the region use the same assessments (Vi-SPDAT) and tools and share information within the same HMIS (ClientTrack) system. Currently the client's health plan/MCP is not tracked within the system. All CoC and ESG funded programs are required to participate in CES/HMIS, but not all agencies providing homeless services (those outside the funding requirement) are using CES and the HMIS system.

Households seeking assistance can access support through 2-1-1 (operated by Kings United

Way), partner agencies, street outreach and housing navigators. The community has comprehensive policies and procedures for the coordinated entry system, clear triage protocols and follows a housing first approach. The CoC has implemented HUD's Equal Access Rule and is consistently working to identify and address any access issues.

There are multiple Local Initiative Navigation Centers (L.I.N.C.) throughout Kings and Tulare counties that serve as access points for CES, including the Hanford Episcopal Church of the Saviour, Corcoran Community Christians for Emergency Aid, the Visalia Rescue Mission, and the Porterville Navigation Center. Service providers including CSET, Family Services or Tulare County, Central California Family Crisis Center, KCAO, Salvation Army in Hanford, and Champions Recovery are also access points for CES. In addition, housing navigators and street outreach teams conduct outreach to people experiencing homelessness directly through Kingsview PATH, KTHA CES Housing Navigators, the city of Tulare Encampment Resolution Program, Champions Recovery, and KCAO.

KTHA partners with both the Kings and Tulare County Human Services Agencies (HSA) and County Homelessness Task Forces to do collaborative planning and funding for the region. [KTHA has partnered with Anthem Blue Cross](#) to strengthen partnerships between the local Continuum of Care, health plan, and community partners to better serve people experiencing homelessness through integration of health and homeless services, including the implementation of CalAIM, alignment of the Coordinated Entry System, and improved data sharing across sectors for Kings/Tulare counties. An innovative aspect of the partnership includes flexible funding for lease-up of Anthem members, which resulted in a 40% drop in inpatient admissions in the population. In addition, HHIP dollars were used to create a CalAIM Coordinator role to support integration across the counties and fund various system enhancements described in the funding landscape analysis table.

Accelerating assets for the system of care include medical/legal partnerships to address evictions, legal fees/fines and other barriers to housing, and accelerated access to benefits through a SOAR coordinator. KTHA has partnered with both Kings and Tulare counties to have rapid access to support with Social Security Disability applications, although no SOAR coordinator is reported in the counties. One agency that offers free legal support is [Central California Legal Services](#) in Tulare County.

The diverse geography and broad footprint of Kings and Tulare counties could benefit from a community of care build, including geo-mapping the population and assets to serve them, identifying a coordinated table for case conferencing related to Enhanced Care Management (ECM) and Community Support providers, and working together on the next level of regional system build.

When analyzed in conjunction with specific county subpopulation data, gaps and next action steps can be identified.

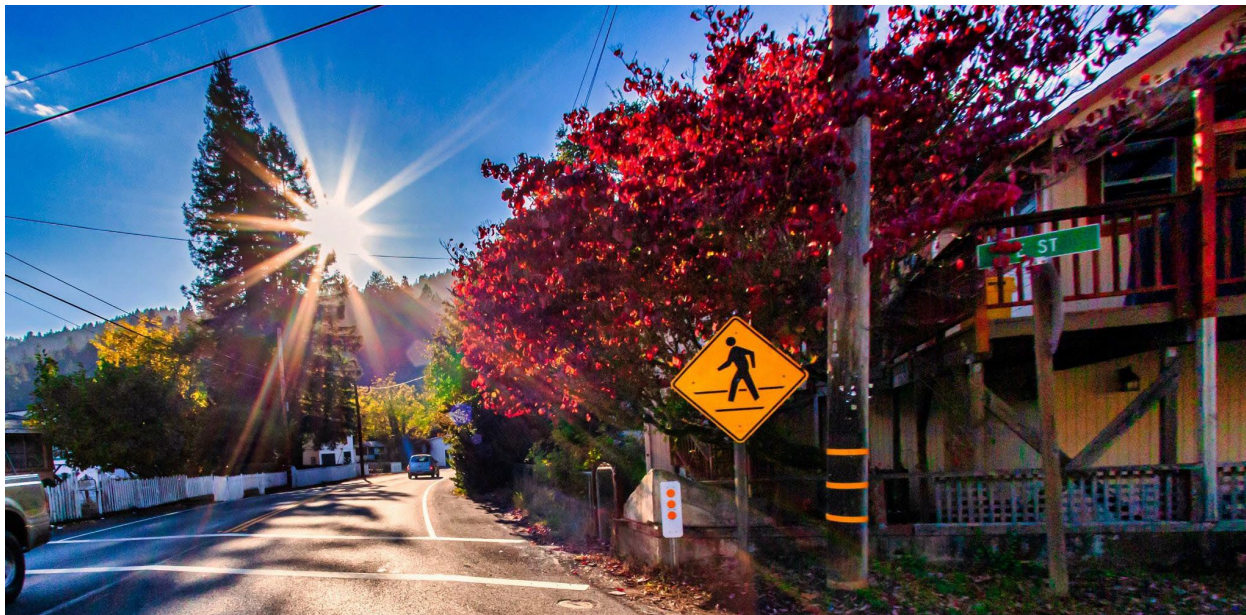
